

Analyzing Student Data in the Dashboard

The Teacher Dashboard provides so much valuable data. Here are some ways you might want to use it:

Looking for whole class trends

Once your students start working on Lalilo, you'll be able to start noticing class trends.

Look through the columns of individual lessons or lesson clusters and take note of areas where the whole class is struggling.

This can help you plan for review and reteaching with the whole class.

Making small groups

As you look for whole group trends, you'll notice small group trends as well. This makes identifying students for flexible intervention groups almost effortless. Use the error analysis page for these small groups to understand misconceptions and plan intervention lessons.

Conferring

Use the dashboard to help you diagnose problem areas for individuals you are conferring with. You can even work through a lesson in Lalilo one-on-one with a student and provide coaching for tricky subjects.

Reporting data for parents

Use dashboard data and the standards and skills report for report card data, or share this page with parents during conferences. If you are doing a virtual conference, just share your screen or email a screenshot.
